

Seraphim Alvanides visiting professor (Northumbria University, Newcastle - UK) will give a seminar on:

From Urban Transport to Active Mobilities: Lessons from North East England



Abstract: Adopting Fred Ken's famous quote "If you plan cities for cars and traffic, you get cars and traffic", this seminar revisits the past in light of the present transport situation in parts of North East England. Focusing on Newcastle upon Tyne and the surrounding conurbations as a case study, I will present two recent transport policy initiatives and report on two research projects related to cycling. It will become apparent that the "planning baggage" of post-industrial cities tends to compete with visions of urban futures. As a result, investing on ad hoc transport infrastructure without full consultation and

thorough planning has generated friction and unrest. I will argue that the casualty of this conflict are active and sustainable forms of mobility, such as walking and cycling.

Seraphim Alvanides is an urban social geographer, with expertise in quantitative methods and Geographical Information Systems and Science (GIS/Sc). His earlier research interests involve the analysis of population census data in order to identify patterns of social deprivation and health inequalities. His more recent work concerns obesogenic environments, such as availability of food outlets and physical activity opportunities, in the context of social/environmental justice. Putting his research into practice, He is also involved with charities and volunteer organisations promoting active lifestyles, such as Sustrans, Living Streets, NEAT (North East Active Travel) and the Transport and Health Study Group (THSG).
