Registration is open for the workshop "Community, Policies, and Social Change: Case Studies from Uganda" (18 hours, May 2024).

OBJECTIVES

The series of lessons - taught by Ugandan faculty members from Makerere University - is interdisciplinary and aimed at training students interested in the dynamics of transformation on the African continent and, more generally, in issues of development and social change.
